

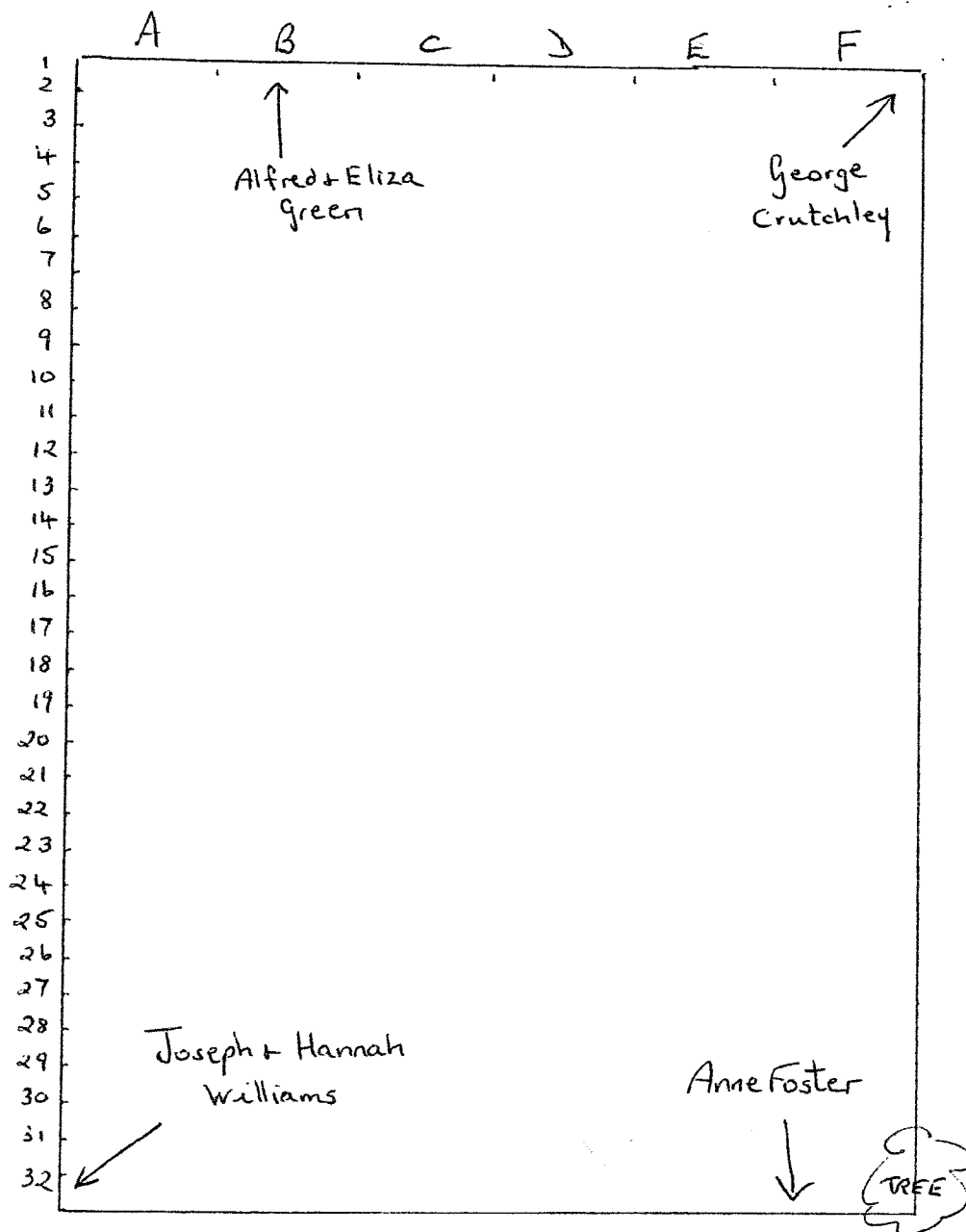
Graves marking the corners of Zone F are as follows:

There is a grassy area at A23. The grave at A21 is that of Joseph Dudley d. 1947 etc

C23 - Beatrice Jennings d. 1948

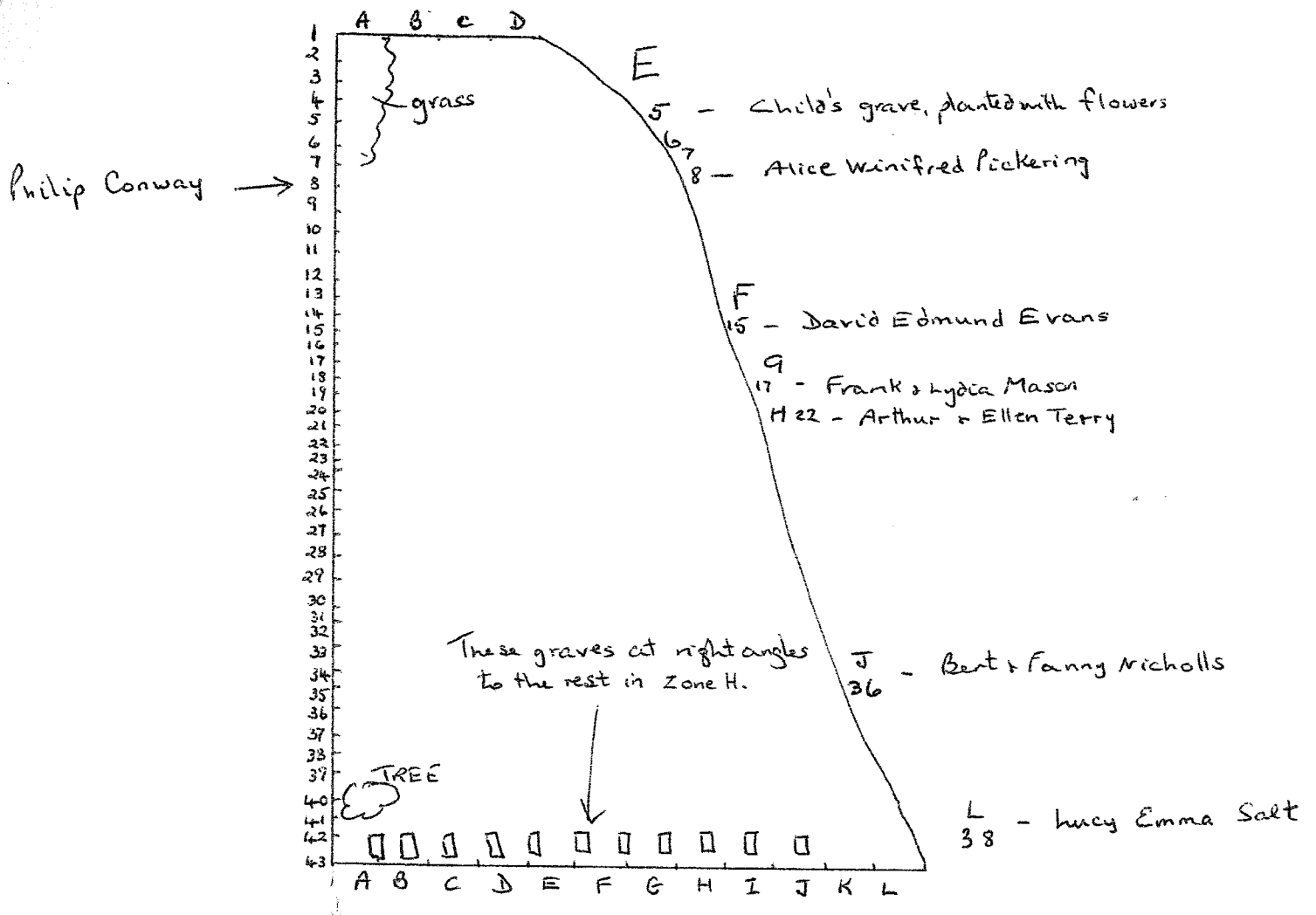


Graves marking the corners of Zone G:

The grave at A1 is broken and unidentifiable. B1 is the grave of Alfred & Eliza Green
F1 - George Crutchley d. 1938 (?)
A32 - Joseph & Hannah Williams
There is a tree at F32. At E32 is the grave of Anne Foster d. 1937.

As will be seen from the diagram, this is rather an awkward zone to plot in terms rows and numbers of graves per row. The large number of grassy patches doesn't help, because in places it is necessary to guess how many graves are now hidden in a particular grassy space. There appear to be 43 graves or plots in Row A, possible 45 in B and probably only 38 in D. Because of the shape of Zone H, there seems to be only one grave in the final row, L.. Inevitably, a record of the location of graves in this Zone, therefore, will be less precise than for other zones.

The first few graves in Row A are covered in rough grass.

A8 (?) - is the grave of Philip Conway d.1939

The last identifiable grave in Row A (2nd from tree) is that of James & Sarah Williams

The first identifiable grave in Row E (E8?) is that of Alice Winifred Pickering d. 1956

At E15 is the grave of David Edmund Evans d. 1968

At G17 - Frank & Lydia Mason

At H22 - Arthur & Ellen Terry

None of the graves in Row I is identifiable

At J36 - Bert & Fanny Nicholls

At L38 - Lucy Emma Salt

... graves in each row (eg C43 D43. E43) are set at right angles to all the

There are more than 50 graves in Zone I, but many have disappeared from sight. I think it is best to record them by calling the grave of James Wallace (d.1981) I1. I2 will be the next obvious grave site (identifiable or not), but ignore grassy spaces where it is impossible to know if a grave was ever accommodated there or not.

There are 7 graves here. J1 will be that of Ernesta & Thomas Grosvenor

This is the oldest part of the graveyard. The eastern section is Zone K, the western Zone L. In Zone K, row A is the row at the boundary with New Cross Hospital, and rows continue to Y followed by AA, the final row. Row Z is the strip running along the south boundary.

Zone L comprises rows A to J, J being the row closest to Graiseley Lane.
